## **SECTION RULES/GUIDELINES**

- 1 An exhibit is defined as natural plant material, with or without accessories.
- 2 All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitor and must be staged in the exhibition hall. EXCEPT Classes 801, 802, 805 and 806.
- 3 All measures are approximate.
- 4 All exhibits must be staged within the space provided.
- 5 No exhibitor may enter more than one exhibit in any one class.
- 6 Fresh plant material to predominate in all classes.
- 7 Any additional backgrounds or drapes must be self-supporting. No pins or accessories to be attached to the niches.
- 8 Accessories should be in scale and not predominate over plant material.
- 9 All exhibits will be judged from the front, and sides of each exhibit.

807 **“Ground Force”** An exhibit. Space allowed 915mm width x 610mm depth (36” x 24”) WI TROPHY

808 **“Ready, Steady, Cook”** An exhibit to include, kitchen item(s), fruit(s) and/or veg. Space allowed 762mm width x 610mm depth (30” x 24”) CISX TROPHY

809 **“A bit of Drama”** An exhibit. Your favourite drama. This class must include a title card. Space allowed 762mm width x 610mm depth (30” x 24”) GFAS TROPHY

810 **“Gardener’s World”** An exhibit. Space allowed 762mm width x 610mm depth (30” x 24”) LE FRIQUET PLANT CENTRE VOUCHER
